

The 1879 Heritage Society was created by the St. Joseph School Endowment in 1998 when board members realized that, through the years, donors who had made the Endowment the beneficiary of their estate in some way were not being formally recognized during their lifetime for their generosity, thoughtfulness, and foresight. CLASS FUNDS

ongratulations to the alumni Classes of 1944, 1945, 1949, 1954, 1956, 1957, 1964, 1965, 1966, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1977, 1978, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1986, 2003, 2005, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019. Also the in-school classes of 2020-2027 (11th grade - 5th grades) are fully funded and all awarded a grant to the school this year.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CLASS


- Scholarship offers \$1,642,640
- Scholarships accepted \$813,084
- 23 seniors participated in the UCA Concurrent Credit Program, earning 6-11 college credit hours each for a class total of 248 college credit hours.
- ACT score averages: Composite 24, English 26, Math 23, Reading 27, Science 24
- 19 seniors were members of the National Honor Society with 20 Honor Graduates.
- 97% plan to continue their education at either a 2-year or 4-year college.
- 11 of the 29 are children of St. Joseph alumni; 9 are grandchildren of alumni.

- 8 members of the class received Presidential Awards for Excellence (signed certificate by President Trump) which requires being an honor graduate with 30+ on the ACT Reading, English, or Math tests. They were Jackson, Jacob, Aaryanna, Katherine, Jacinta, Natalie, Zachary, and Carolyn.
- Father Dellert Award for Outstanding Senior Girl and Senior Boy is the highest honor given to two seniors who best exemplify their school, community, and faith. This year's recipients were Carolyn Woodson and Jackson Briggler.
- College destinations for the fall include Arkansas State (Beebe), Arkansas Tech, College of the Ozarks (Missouri), Henderson State, Hendrix, SCAD, Texas A&M, Texas Tech, U of A Fayetteville, U of A Pulaski Tech, and UCA.


