ENDOWMENT ANNUAL BANQUET CELEBRATED

The St. Joseph School Endowment held its Annual Donor Appreciation Banquet on Wednesday, September 27th at the Spiritan Center with nearly 150 in attendance. Guests were served a delicious meal of Mandarin orange salad, roast beef, potato casserole, green beans, roll, and cheesecake.

Rev. Joseph Archibong, current pastor in Berryville and Eureka Springs and previous associate pastor here at St. Joseph's, was our guest speaker. It was an evening filled with laughter. Fr. Joseph's speech was entitled, "Every Child Deserves a Catholic Education." He gave his own testimony on how his Catholic education played such a vital role in the person he became and how everyone should be a champion for a student and support Catholic education.

"I do sometimes wonder what I would have been today if my parents didn't deny themselves of so many comforts to send me to Catholic school and if I weren't given a scholarship that kept me going. I am therefore standing here today as a proud product of Catholic education," said Fr. Joseph. "I am here not only because of my parents and family but also because of those wonderful teachers at that Catholic school who loved me, taught me, and made me feel like I was somebody. They picked me up on days I was down on myself. Many of them are still so proud of me today, and I am proud of them. Endowment Annual Banquet Celebrated (continued)

Mr. Matthew Tucker, St. Joseph School Principal, gave a School Report. Highlights from his report included student population – PreK -12 is 507, K-12 is 445. He touched on each area of Faith, Learning, and Living, the school's tag line. Alicia Yrle, High School English teacher then recited a poem entitled, "Where I'm From," composed of writings from the current 33 juniors. Class members were given an assignment to pen a poem describing "the people, places, values, and communities" that have shaped them into who they are today. Mrs. Jacqueline Kordsmeier, Endowment Executive Director, gave a year of review for the Endowment. Highlights included the creation of three new designated funds, items granted to the school this past year (total of \$61,106.97), the allocation of \$75,000 given to the school's general budget, the rent value of the Elementary School property and After School Program facility (both assets of the Endowment), and newest members added to the 1879 Heritage Society this past year. See additional highlights for this current school year below. Mrs. Kordsmeier thanked the many donors present for their continued support of the Endowment which makes all this possible. She challenged the group for someone to come forward to begin the 100th Designated Fund in the Endowment. Her challenge was met. This 100th fund will be released in the next newsletter.

- \$347,357 given in value to SJS during the 2022/23 school year
- Up to \$364,030 in value is available for the 2023/24 school year which includes:
 - \$75,000 to SJS budget (= \$165 credit per student)
 - \$31,240 for tuition assistance
 - \$23,770 for maintenance
 - \$22,770 for all other categories
 - And \$211,250 in rent value
- Given to SJS since inception in 1976 \$3.3 million in cash and \$3 million in rent value
- Total Assets of the Endowment as of 7/31/23 -\$10,972,558.05
